Emerging and developing theater companies selected for performances in the downtown Storefront and Studio Theaters

The Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events in partnership with the Chicago Office of Tourism and Culture announce the 2011 fall season of events at the Chicago DCA Theaters—the Storefront Theater, located at 66 E. Randolph Street, and the Studio Theater in the Chicago Cultural Center, 78 E. Washington Street.

Chicago DCA Theater offers downtown audiences an off-Loop theater experience with an exciting look at the vibrant theater companies that call Chicago home. As an anchor of the downtown theater district, the DCA Storefront Theater schedule will feature two world premiere productions (one by Mortar Theatre Company and one by Strange Tree Group), and a Chicago premiere by Polarity Ensemble Theatre.
